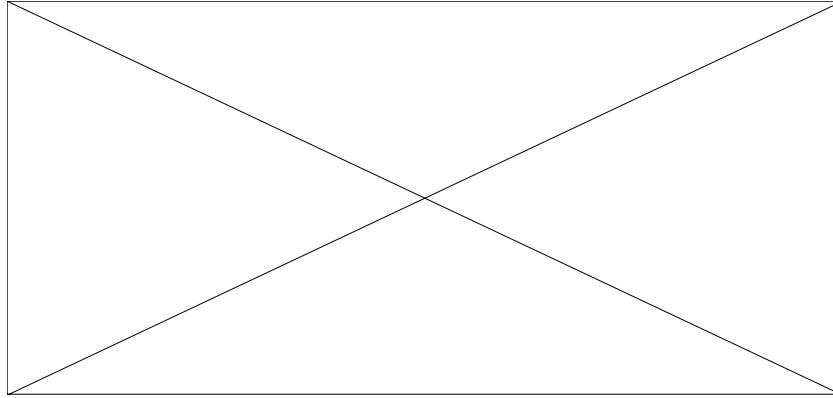

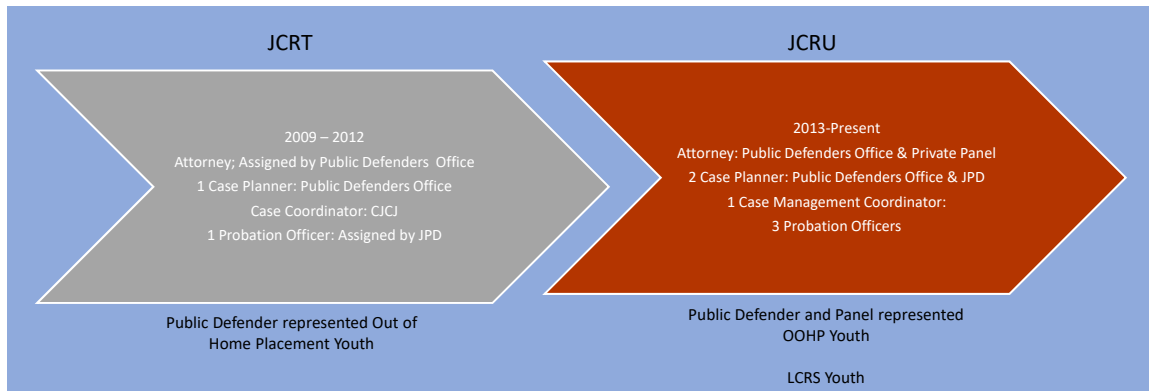
## The JCRU Team

## JCRU Process: Pre-Entry

---

- Packet received for youth committed to OOHP or LCR
- Conference Date with Placement P.O.
- Placement P.O. and JCRU PO visits youth's proposed home for suitability.
- Case Conference with the Caregiver, Attorney, Case Planner, Case Management Coordinator, Placement P.O, and JCRU P.O.
- Identify which agencies will be used in the Aftercare Plan

## JCRU Process: Reentry

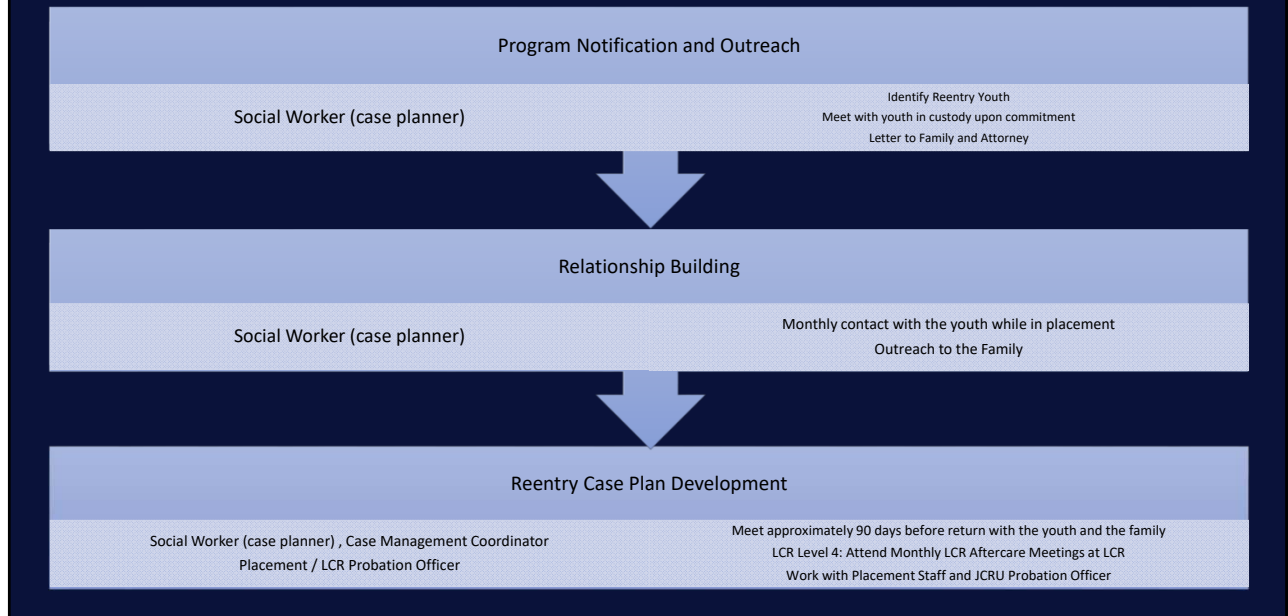
---

- Aftercare Plan is built, vetted and approved by the JCRU Team
- Submits Aftercare Plan to the Court for approval
- Youth finishes their respective program
- Youth reenters the community with the Aftercare Plan in place
- Progress Report in approximately 30 days

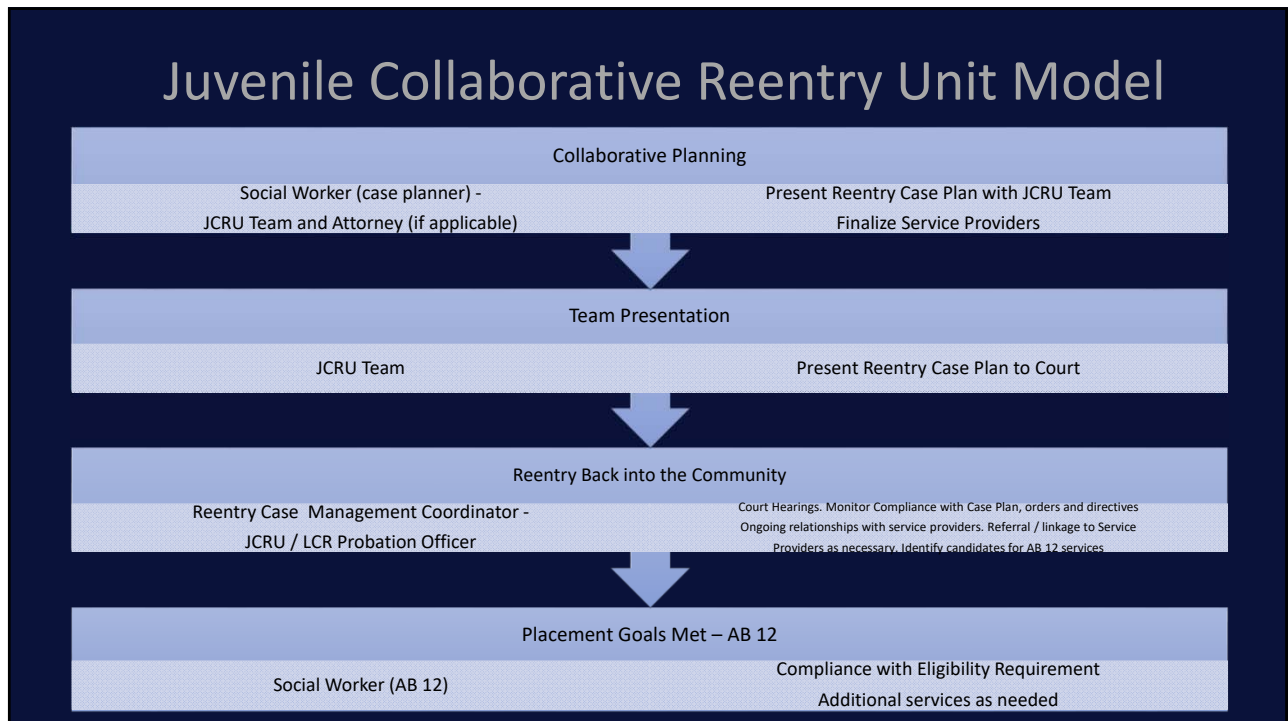

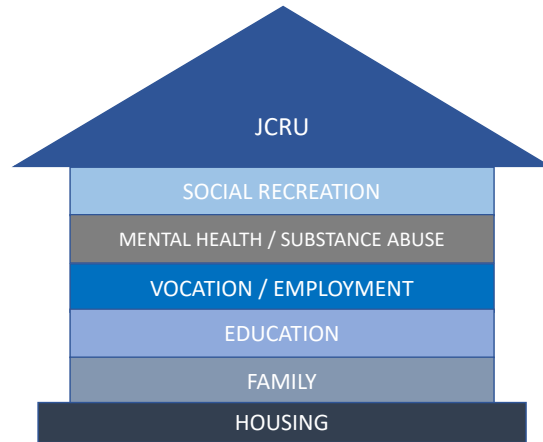
# Juvenile Collaborative Reentry Unit Model

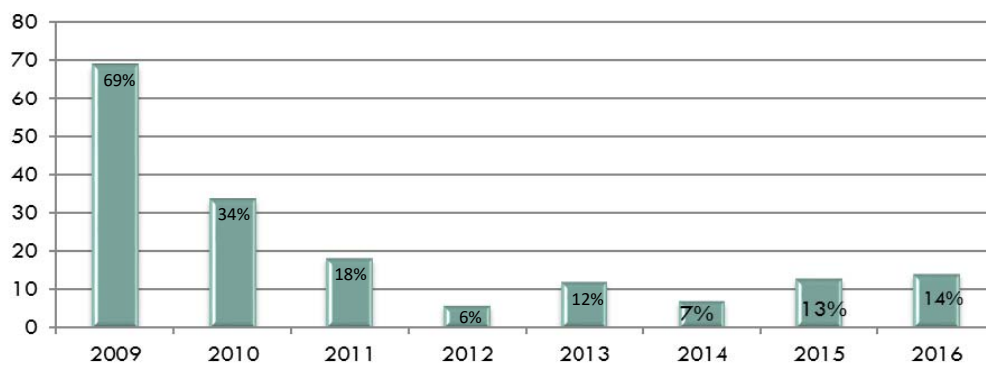


# The House That JCRU Built

## Challenges Facing SFJPD Youth

Poor work experience and little to no vocational training

Behavioral and mental health issues that interfere with education and employment

Unreliable family support and limited family resources

Lack of services coordination within the systems of care
