RETURN OF YOUTH TO DIVISION OF JUVENILE FACILITIES  
FOR VIOLATION OF CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION**

For a youth discharged from the Division of Juvenile Facilities to the jurisdiction of the committing court, that person may be detained by probation, for the purpose of initiating proceedings to modify the youth's conditions of supervision if there is probable cause to believe that the youth has violated any of the court-ordered conditions of supervision.

Within 15 days of detention, the committing court shall conduct a modification hearing for the youth. Pending the hearing, the youth may be detained by probation.

Modification may include, as a sanction for a finding of a serious violation or a series of repeated violations of the conditions of supervision, an order for the re-confinement of a youth under eighteen (18) years of age in a juvenile facility, or for the re-confinement of a youth eighteen (18) years of age or older in a juvenile facility as authorized by Section 208.5, or for the re-confinement of a youth eighteen (18) years of age or older in a local adult facility or the Division of Juvenile Facilities.

For returns to Division of Juvenile Facilities, the youth may be returned for a specific amount of time which must be no shorter than ninety (90) days to no longer than one (1) year.

**Process for returns to Division of Juvenile Facilities (DJF):**

1. After the court hearing which orders a youth's return to DJF, the following documents should be forwarded to DJF Intake and Court Services(ICS):
  - Court Order. The following information should be included on the court order:
    - Violation Offense(s)
    - Disposition of Violation/Specific Release Date
    - Amount of Available Confinement Time
    - Jurisdiction Age
    - Special Education Status
    - Medication and Authority to Dispense
    - Restitution Balance
    - Victim Information
  - Probation Report- Describing Performance on Probation and Violation(s)
  - DJF Mental Health Assessment Form(DJJ 1.205) and any relevant Psychological/Psychiatric Reports
  - Probation Staff contact information-Name and Number

2. Upon acceptance of the case, ICS will process the case and send an acceptance letter to county. Probation returnee's will be assigned a "P" number.
3. The county shall call the appropriate reception center and schedule a delivery date.
4. Once in DJF custody, should the youth engage in serious misconduct, the facility shall forward the disciplinary report to ICS who will contact and forward the report to the responsible probation department for appropriate action.
5. Sixty days prior to the youth's release date, ICS shall contact the responsible Probation Department to coordinate release arrangements. DJF will request from the Probation Department:
  - Who youth will reside with upon release
  - Address of where youth will reside
  - Transportation arrangements
6. Once information is obtained, facility staff shall complete the appropriate registration notifications (sex offender, arson, gang and narcotics registration)
7. Upon the youth's release, DJF facility staff will contact the responsible Probation Office and notice of youth's release.
