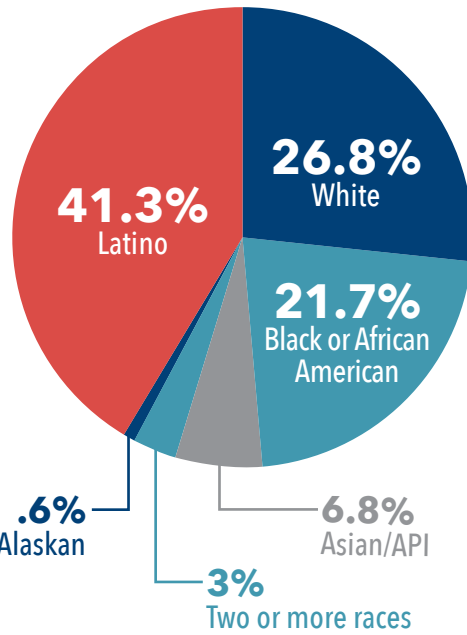

51% of probation officers are **FEMALE**



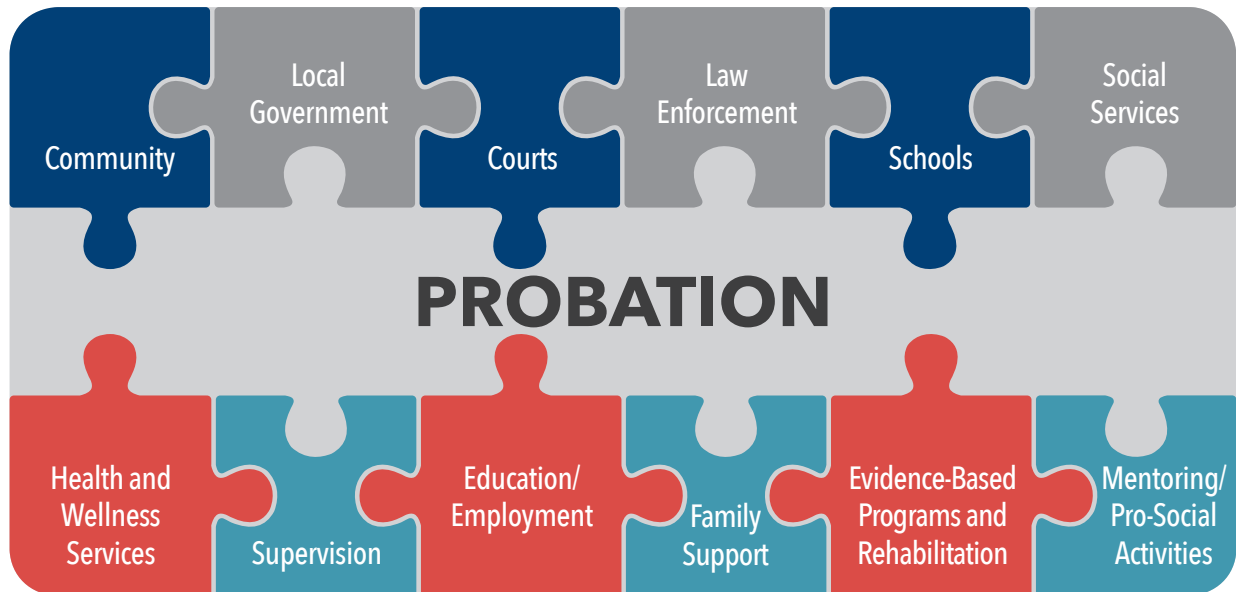

Highly Trained and Educated

- ✓ 350 hours of training in first two years; at least 40 hours annually thereafter. Additional training includes:
 - deescalation techniques
 - trauma-informed care
 - weaponless defense/defensive tactics
 - cognitive behavioral therapy
 - building entry and search tactics
 - therapeutic and strength-based care
- ✓ Majority with 4-year college degrees

Probation is trained to safely connect people in the justice system to the accountability and rehabilitation they need to succeed.



Why Probation Works

Probation promotes public safety by helping people ready to change and protecting communities from those who aren't. No other system does both.

Probation connects accountability and rehabilitation to improve safety and restoration.

As sworn peace officers, Probation officers are trained experts prepared to hold people accountable while guiding their rehabilitation process.

Probation is a court-ordered sentence served in the community, with conditions that enforce accountability, support rehabilitation, and reduce prison admissions.
