Foster Care: Efforts to enhance services, treatment and residential care. Effective strategies to improve outcomes for foster care youth involved in the justice system with a focus on child and family teaming, wraparound, Family First Prevention Services Act, resource family recruitment and retention efforts, partnerships with STRTPs and AB 12 programs.

Pretrial: Effective pretrial programs aimed at supporting the court decision making process, community monitoring and enhancing return to court.

Wellness: The physical and mental well-being of probation professionals, addressing stress management, self-care, and overall health.

Evidence-Based, Promising and Innovative Practices: Evidence-based programs and promising practices that have demonstrated positive results in probation and reentry efforts. New and innovative approaches being used or researched.

Technology, Data and Fiscal Analytics: Role of technology and data analytics in improving the probation profession. Strategies for effective fiscal management in probation departments and funding opportunities for innovative programs.





Submission Guidelines:

- Presentation proposals should be submitted online by December 5, 2023.
- Each proposal should include a title, a brief 25–35-word synopsis of the session, a 250-word abstract, a brief bio of the presenter(s) in paragraph format, and the preferred session format (lecture, panel, workshop, or interactive discussion).
- Presentations should be 90 minutes in duration, including time for Q&A.
- Panel sessions are limited to 4 presenters. A bio is required for all proposed panelists.
