The first training session will be held on Wednesday, June 22nd from 12pm to 2pm PST. This monthly training series is designed for probation officers, superior court staff, judicial officers, and other pretrial service providers who are focused on the delivery of pretrial services. This six-part series will cover:

- Foundational pretrial legal principles
- Guiding principles for pretrial services
- Providing pretrial services equitably
- Responsible use of pretrial risk assessment tools
- Role of pretrial services at the arraignment hearing
- Monitoring strategies and supportive services that help people succeed while on pretrial release
- Pretrial services performance measures

Module 3: Arraignment Hearing – August 17, 2022

Training will be held 12:00pm to 2:00pm for all six modules.
