

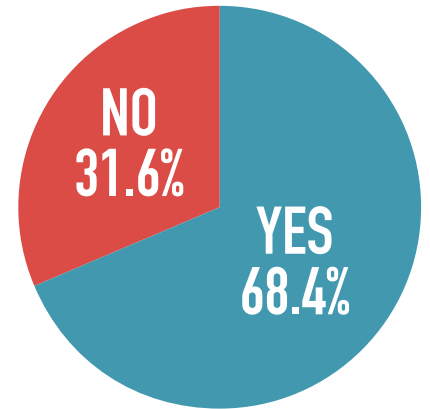
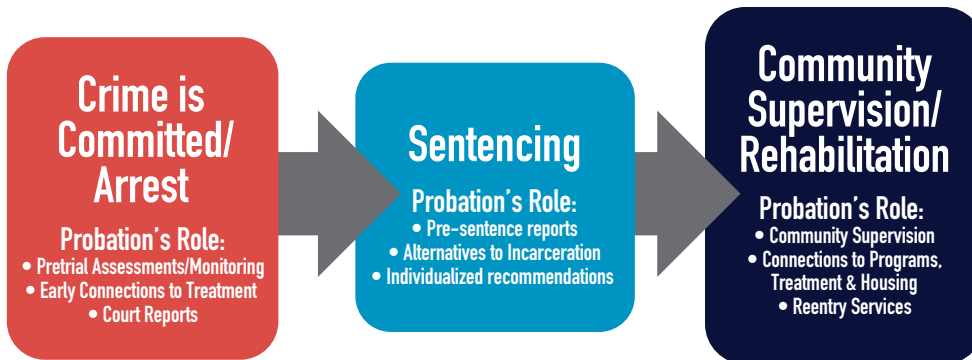
PROPOSITION 36 IMPLEMENTATION: Funding Probation for Success

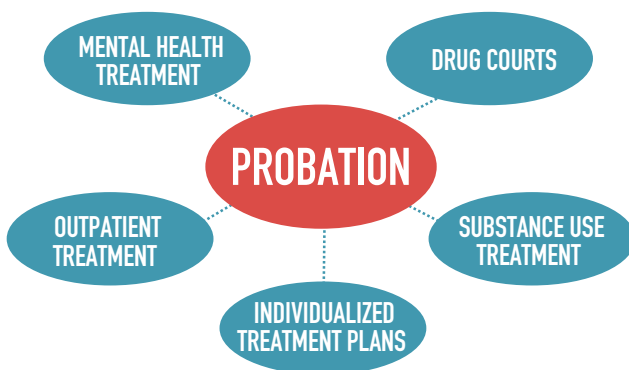


Delivering on Voter Expectations

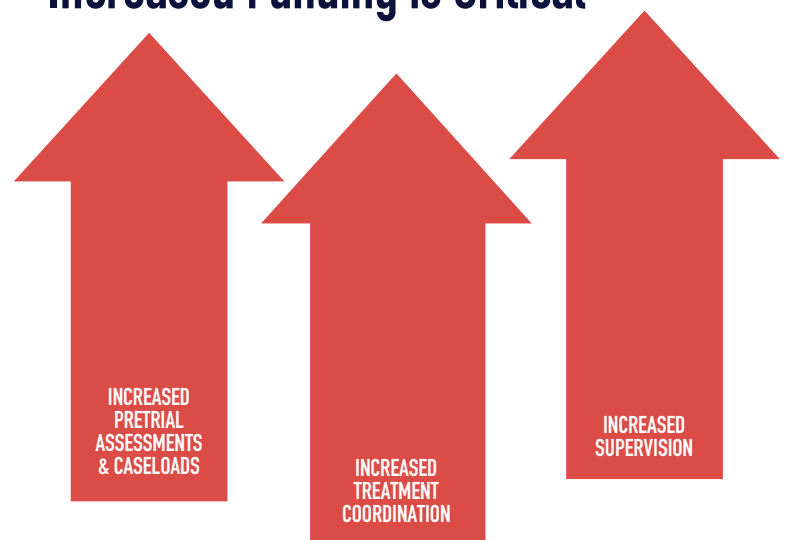
Voters approved Proposition 36 by nearly 70% to create safer communities and expand rehabilitation. Funding probation helps deliver both.
