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Group vs Foster Care

Group care has unintended consequences:

- association with other delinquents creates negative behaviors such as:
 - increased aggressiveness,
 - delinquent behaviors,
 - substance abuse.



You spend years wishing your parents would get off your back, only to realize they're the only ones who ever really had your back.

Performance Foster Care

Who are the Kids that need PFC in CA?



- ✓ Aggressive/violent kids
- ✓ History of delinquency, criminal activities
- ✓ Conduct Disorders, PTSD, ODD
- ✓ Problematic sexual behaviors
- School issues and difficulties
- ✓ Lots of trauma history/responses

Performance Foster Care

"This isn't your Grandma's foster care anymore!"



Who are successful PFC Parents?

- reinforce positive/appropriate behaviors
- closely supervise at all times
- carefully monitor peer associations
- specify clear, consistent rules and limits
- consistently follow through with consequences
- encourage youth to develop academic skills and positive work habits
- engage youth's family to be highly involved
- assist with building a positive relationship between youth and his family
- mentor youth's family to develop parenting skills and communication



Critical Program Components

- Individualized daily program for youth (No more than 2)
- •strong FP-CM-PO relationship w/daily consultation
- high involvement with youth's family
- specialized pre-service/in-service training
- •24/7 live person crisis response
- •strong emphasis on FP teaching interpersonal skills, involving youth in positive social activities
- exceptional supports to foster parents including pay,
 respect and inclusion
- •regular home visits for youth with family
- program has school liaison for school transition/issues
- each youth has a positive, strong mentor
- aftercare program and services for youth and family

What's your Message???

- Need to clearly define/articulate what TxFC is to public
- Honest about roles/responsibilities and challenges
- Highlight positive impact of fostering on the child/family
- Talk about supports provided
- •Do not have to be superheros!!!
- •NO rescue messages!!!

Targets for Recruitment

- Working class, not necessarily professionals
- Don't have kids under age 15 living in the home
- Communities with tradition of extended kinship care
- Teachers, paramedics, health care, firefighters
- Experience and skills working with teens
- Juvenile Justice employees
- Special Education teachers
- LGBTQ families/Affirming Families
- Retired social workers
- Military families



Tips for Recruiting FH for your Youth

- Use your data!
- Be targeted in your recruitment
- Use teens, FP & youth's family to tell the story
- Develop targeted materials
- Include supports in recruitment materials/messages
- Be clear about expectations for FP and youth
- Be responsive to interested people
- Hand carry applicants through the approval process so you don't lose them
